

## . . YOU KNOW YOUR COMMUNITY SHELTER PLAN

Suppose it is 9:30 P.M.

You and your family are at home.

Suddenly, you hear Civil Defense sirens.

A bulletin flashes on radio and television: "Radar has detected missiles approaching the United States. Take shelter immediately." Would you know what to do?

A nuclear attack may never come. But it may come. Certainly you want to be prepared . . . just in case.

This Civil Defense Community Shelter Plan outlines the present status of fallout shelter protection in Dallas County. In has been prepared and approved by your local, state and federal governmental officials.

By reading and understanding this PLAN now, you and your family can learn what to do and where to go for maximum protection in case of nuclear attack.

You owe this preparation to yourself and your family.

FOLLOW THIS PLAN — IT GIVES YOU THE MAXIMUM

CHANCE FOR SURVIVAL.



#### . YOU RECOGNIZE THE DANGER

Should the United States come under nuclear attack, radar detection equipment would alert the United States Defence Command and the warning would be sounded as soon as possible. At that time, it would not be known where the bomb might strike.

But even if Dallas County were not hit, local residents could be endangered by fallout.

Fallout is the name for deadly radioactive dust particles which could spread hundreds of miles down-wind from the point of an explosion. How long would it take fallout to reach Dallas County? That would depend on the distance of the explosion from Dallas, its intensity and the velocity and direction of the winds. In might arrive in minutes or hours.



Primary danger from fallout is gamma radiation. Like X-Rays, gamma rays are invisible and can penetrate solid material. Gamma rays destroy living tissue and can cause sickness or death. Gamma rays present in fallout cannot make anything else radioactive.

Food and water are contaminated only to the extent that they contain the fallout particles. Exposed food can be eaten after washing or peeling.

However, the damage of radiation decreases rapidly. Seven hours after an explosion, the radiation level is one-tenth what it was an hour after the blast. Two days after a blast, radiation is only one-hundredth as strong.



#### . YOU RECOGNIZE THE WARNING

The Dallas County Community Shelter Plan was developed with one idea in mind: to inform you, in advance, what to do in case of nuclear attack.

Warning to Dallas County residents will come in a matter of seconds after the National Warning System detects an attack.

Sirens will sound the warning.

WAVERING TONE: (3 to 5 minutes) ACTION — GO TO SHELTER IMMEDIATELY. Attack on U.S. has been detected. STEADY TONE: ACTION — LISTEN TO LOCAL RADIO FOR INSTRUCTIONS.



Local Civil Defense officials will be on radio to broadcast the facts of the crisis and to give instructions.

#### PURPOSE OF THIS PLAN

This PLAN of action was developed by professional engineers and planners to offer maximum protection from nuclear radiation for all Dallas County residents. The local PLAN is a part of the nationwide Civil Defense Program, and is designed:

- To utilize shelter facilities in existing buildings by determining the shelter space available in such building, and the population that can be accommodated in that building.
- To give instructions on ways to improvise shelter at the homes or offices of those persons who cannot reach public shelter in the specified time.
- 3. To determine the need for additional shelter in areas where it is not now available.

If you find you live or work in an area where shelter is not available, you can improvise shelter with materials at hand.
THIS PLAN TELLS YOU HOW!

If you are in an area where shelters are not available when the warning sounds, use this time to improvise shelter until otherwise directed by local officials. If, following the warning, it is determined that more time is available to reach shelter, instructions will be broadcast on local radio stations.

If you follow this PLAN, less confusion will result and the maximum number of people can be protected.

You owe it to yourself and your family to read this PLAN. Know in advance what to do and where to go when the warning sounds.



## FALLOUT SHELTE

#### YOU ARE PREPARED

Licensing a building makes it eligible for emergency supplies.

Most licensed shelters are clearly marked with the familiar sign seen here. As eligible buildings are licensed, they will be so marked.

Most shelters will have a trained Shelter Manager in charge. He will expect your cooperation throughout your stay.

Most licensed shelters have limited emergency Civil Defense supplies, not sufficient for extended stay. These supplies are furnished by the Federal Government and are constantly being stocked in other shelters when authorized by building management, during the continuous Civil Defense preparedness program.

#### SUGGESTED SUPPLIES TO TAKE TO THE PUBLIC SHELTER

Pick out the ones that may be needed and can be carried in a small bag or suitcase.

Supplies of prescription medicines for diabetics, heart

- patients, etc
- Special medicines and food for the care of invalids and
- A small package of supplementary foods (canned meats, dried foods, sugar, salt, canned fruit, and milk).
- Blanket, sleeping bag, or air mattress.
- Extra change of clothing in a plastic bag.
- Small first aid kit.
- Soap, tooth paste, tooth brush, and towels.
- Portable radio plus batteries, books, games, and compact
- Flashlight plus batteries.
- Paper toweling
- Your copy of this Community Shelter Plan.

DO NOT OVERLOAD ANY INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERABLE WALKING MAY BE REQUIRED

#### WHAT NOT TO TAKE

- Pets.
- Weapons
- Alcoholic beverages.
- Bulky packages.
- Foods requiring cooking or cooling (refrigeration). Heat or flame producing devices, except matches and lighters.



#### . IF YOU KNOW WHERE TO GO

On the following pages you will find maps of Dallas County divided into areas. (City limits are not shown.)

These maps show all buildings that may be used for shelter and the boundaries of the area served by the shelter - some large; some small; some stocked with food; some not. The policy of the National Office of Civil Defense and of the Policy Council for the Community Shelter Plan, is to show all shelters whether or not they are licensed and stocked. To obtain information on the status of each building, call your Civil Defense office.

The County map on Page 4 shows the general outline of the areas and refers you to other pages for details and guidance for each area. Instructions for using the map are shown on each page.

In each area you will find certain portions shaded YELLOW. certain portions shaded RED and certain portions WHITE (unshaded). These shaded portions indicate what you should do if you are located there when the warning sounds.

In developing this PLAN, the planners had the problem of determining where each citizen should go in order that the maximum number of citizens would have shelter protection against fallout. As criteria, the most severe condition was assumed, i.e., a nighttime attack. Should attack come in daytime, many more people could reach public shelters. The majority of public shelters are in the downtown and industrial areas. Deficit shelter space is in the residential and suburban areas

To arrive at a logical PLAN the following analysis was made:

- 1st: All buildings in the County (that by visual inspection seemed to offer shelter) were surveyed by Army Engineers.
- 2nd: A population count was estimated, and the number of people who could walk to the closest shelter (up to shelter capacity) is shown in the YELLOW areas. Everyone located in a YELLOW area when the warning is sounded should walk to the nearest shelter shown in that area.

3rd: Those outside the YELLOW areas, obviously would have to provide their own shelter or drive to a shelter more distant. Traffic engineers determined that those near certain transportation arteries could, within a reasonable time, drive, park cars, and walk the remaining distance to certain shelters. This capability is shown in the RED areas. Everyone located in a RED area, when the warning is sounded, should drive to shelter in accordance with instrucions on Page 13.

Persons in WHITE (unshaded) areas could not reach public shelter within a movement time of approximately one hour. This one hour time allocation was suggested to the Policy Council from analysis made by Federal authorities. However, if more time for movement is available than estimated in the plan, persons in the WHITE (unshaded) areas will be given instructions by official radio announcement on how to get to the downtown shelters shown on Page 15.

UNDER THIS PLAN authorized traffic will be controlled: Each person knowing his area at warning time should go as

#### LOCAL OFFICIALS ENDORSE COMMUNITY SHELTER PLAN

There are many variables involved in determining criteria to be used in a Community Shelter Plan: Time of warning of missile strike; location of strike; weather conditions; time of day or night; location; vehicle control and travel time analysis and others.

Those responsible for this PLAN utilized all of talent available to arrive at a solution that would be logical, practical and would shelter the maximum number of people.

The Technical Committee of 28 officials included profes sionals throughout the County responsible for the essential agencies of City and County government such as: Police, Fire,

Public Works, Traffic City Planning, Education, Civil Defense. The Policy Council, including 56 appointees of the 27 cities in the County, made the decisions necessary as criteria to be used by the professional planners who developed details of the PLAN.

The Dallas City Council and County Commissioners Court were represented on both the Technical Committee and the Policy Council. An adequate defense system can deter or minimize an attack by a rational enemy. Our military defen are constantly being improved. BUT JUST AS IMPORTANT IS A SOUND CIVIL DEFENSE PROGRAM.

The Dallas County Community Shelter Plan is part of a nationwide civil defense plan. It has been studied and endorsed by Dallas County and Municipal Government Officials.



## HOW TO USE THIS MAP-


This is the Key Map to Dallas County divided into Areas A through G. Each of the Areas refer the reader to a specific page in this PLAN.


Examine the KEY MAP of Dallas County and determine where you and members of your family would probably be at night and in daytime (home, work, school).




This PLAN should be retained for future ready reference by each family.

Commercial, industrial organizations, schools, libraries, and others should keep copies of this PLAN for ready reference.











#### UNALLOCATED SHELTERS IN DOWNTOWN DALLAS

Basement areas, underground garages, tunnel walkways, and high rise buildings all afford good fallout protection. There is an abundance of such structures in downtown Dallas. The most critical shelter problem is the distance these excellent downtown public shelters are from residential areas.

Shelters listed on this page are available to the public and can be used by anyone, provided he can get to these shelters before the fallout arrives.

Civil Defense officials will keep you constantly informed by LOCAL radio as to radiation conditions in various areas of the county. If fallout arrival forcasts indicate that more time is available, then those persons in the WHITE areas will be instructed to go to shelter. Otherwise, one might be safer in his own improvised shelter. Each person or family must make the determination of what to do in this case.

The downtown shelters shown on Page 14 are allocated to those persons located in RED areas


## YOU KNOW HOW TO IMPROVISE SHELTER

Just because you may be unable to reach shelter does not mean you would be completely unprotected from radioactive fallout. But to have some protection you must know how to improvise shelter in your home or office. This can be done by using materials already available.

REMEMBER! IF A WARNING SOUNDS, YOUR TIME WILL BEST BE SPENT IMPROVISING YOUR SHELTER UNTIL OTHERWISE INSTRUCTED BY CIVIL DEFENSE OFFICIALS OVER LOCAL RADIO.


The basic idea in improvising a fallout shelter is to build up as much mass or heavy material as possible between you and the outside.

Where can this best be done?



IN A ONE-STORY house or building, the most convenient location is in a hallway or a central room. The more walls and celling between you and the outside, the better.

IN A TWO-STORY house or building, a central room or hallway ON THE FIRST FLOOR IS BEST.



In either case, additional protection is needed . . . especially overhead. Begin by placing available solid materials, books, filled boxes, trunks, furniture, magazines, newspapers, on the second floor or the attic directly over the room. Then begin stacking similar soild materials around the outside walls of the room or hallway. If available, bricks, concrete blocks, sand and dirt placed in boxes afford the best protection.

If sufficient quantities of these materials are not available to line a portion of a central room or hallway at least four feet off the floor, prepare a crawl space within the room or hallway. This is done by using a table and stacking available materials around the sides and top. If there is no suitable table, remove a door from its hinges and place it on top of boxes to form a table.

If your home has a basement or an outdoor storm cellar, they offer even better protection from radiation.

A sturdy table or workbench placed in the corner of a basement with solid materials placed on top and around the sides will offer maximum protection.

Protection in a storm cellar may be improved by stacking bricks, concrete blocks or other solid objectes inside the entrance to form a "fourth wall".

If your home is built on a pier and beam foundation, probably the best shelter is available beneath the house. Dig a hole three of four feet wide, eight feet long and about three feet deep, big enough for your family to crawl into. Pile the excavated dirt around the rim of the hole.




#### . YOU EMERGE FROM YOUR SHELTER ONLY AFTER CONDITIONS ARE SAFE

Trained personnel will keep a constant check on the outside radiation level. When conditions are safe, you will be allowed to leave fallout shelters. If at home, listen to your radio to learn when it is safe to leave the shelter.

What will you find when you emerge from your shelter?

Assuming no part of Dallas County is damaged by the blast or fire, the surroundings will be just as they were when the warning sounded.



Decontamination operations will already have begun by authorized personnel washing down the area to flush away accumulated fallout.

Radioactivity will be at a safe level.

Local Civil Defence officials envision a brief period during completion of "decontamination" when those leaving shelters may be housed in hotels, motels, and makeshift "dormitories" until areas are thoroughly decontaminated and made safe again.

When you arrive home, covered and canned food will be safe to eat. If food has been exposed to fallout particles, wash and peel it before eating. Water from the tap and in covered containers will be safe to drink.

#### ... WANT MORE INFORMATION?

When the warning sounds, you can survive if you and your family have prepared your plan of action.

If you do not prepare in advance, there may be too little time to learn what to do when you hear the warning siren.

Your local Civil Defense office has more detailed information on survival planning.

Lectures and Short courses are given regularly by professional Civil Defense personnel on Adult Education, Medical Self-Help, Shelter Management and Radiological Monitoring.

Illustrated talks by Civil Defense professionals are given to civic clubs, school and church groups upon request.

Civil Defense is ready to help or advise. All you have to do is ask. Call your local Civil Defense office.
